Fostering young readers' opinions and engagement through the illumination of children's literature

WHAT IS IT?

The CBCA Shadow Judging the Book of the Year Awards is a national program where young people read 6 shortlisted books from one of the CBCA Book of the Year Award categories (not new Illustrator), discuss, respond, and vote for their choice of winner.

Shadow Judges use the same Book of Year criteria to guide discussion as used by our Expert Judges. This process is supported with resources and each group can avail themselves of further support from your local Branch.

WHY SHOULD YOU BE PART OF THIS PROGRAM?

Shadow judging is one way to **foster reading for pleasure** which can help to engage and empower young people to become lifelong readers. The program helps them to imagine, think critically and creatively— and provides a new nationwide platform to embed young voices into the literary awards conversation.

DID YOU KNOW?

Children who experience an author visit are more likely to enjoy reading widely and consider in greater depth the books they read. We recommend groups invite an author or illustrator to share their expertise with a Shadow Judging group. Connecting young people, books and creatives is a powerful addition to the program.

Schools, libraries, bookshops, parents, grandparents or carers can facilitate a Shadow Judging reading group.

BENEFITS OF THE PROGRAM

READERS ARE SUPPORTED TO:

- > build personal literary appreciation as they are immersed in the language that describes literary techniques
- > are encouraged to imagine, think critically and respond creatively
- > develop a greater self-concept, empathy and awareness of diverse opinions
- > increase their reading repertoire (read more broadly)
- > absorb culture in a community/social context by sharing the experience
- > experience a sense of belonging & agency while sharing stories

HOW TO PREPARE

- 1. Review the Notables Books and choose one appropriate category
- 2. REGISTER via the Shadow Judging Website \$50, decide on group NAME
- 3. Plan and organise your book group
- **4.** Order your books and start as soon as you can after the Shortlist is announced. Older Readers and Younger Readers groups require time to read the 6 shortlisted books

If you would like to participate and need additional financial support, please contact your state CBCA Branch. Many branches offer funding or part-funding for groups who are disadvantaged by regional location or socio-economic circumstances.

A BASIC GUIDE SHADOW JUDGING

AS GROUPS YOU

MEET UP regularly with your facilitator

READ the books

DISCUSS the books in light of the criteria (critical analysis)

RESPOND to the books creatively (individually or collaboratively during or after the reading process)

Consensus **VOTE** on the group's chosen winner (1 winner per group)

CELEBRATE the announcement of the Book of the Year Awards which now includes the Shadow Judges' choice of Winners
